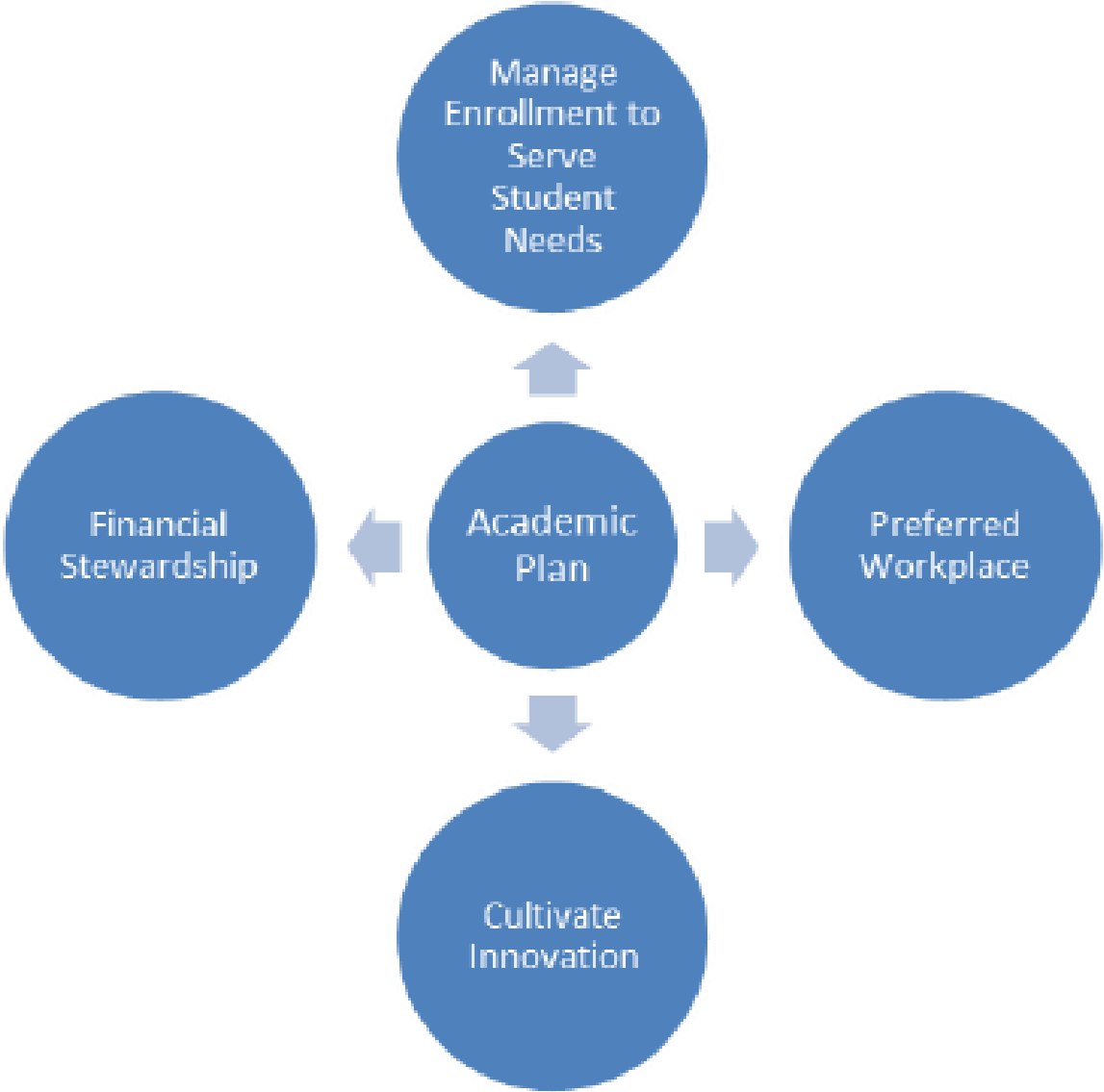

UFS Strategic Priorities - 1

- Reflected in University of Baltimore Goals and Priorities (Revised March 1, 2013)
 - Goal 1: Student Success and Career Readiness
 - Increase student retention and degree progression.
 - Reworking first year experience
 - Reconsider developmental and first year writing and math programs.
 - Enhance student learning through applied, experiential and service learning initiatives.
 - Recognize and reward teaching effectiveness and innovation (define it, measure it)

UFS Strategic Priorities - 2

- Reflected in University of Baltimore Goals and Priorities (Revised March 1, 2013)
 - Goal 2: Foster collaboration across academic divisions
 - Create and expand professional program array at UB, building interdisciplinary programs
 - Expand students' global awareness and cultural competencies... foreign languages, global field study, student exchanges, etc.
 - Increase international student enrollment.

UFS Strategic Priorities - 3

- Reflected in University of Baltimore Goals and Priorities (Revised March 1, 2013)
 - Goal 3: Understand and harness the power of emerging technologies for learning.
 - From a pedagogical and content based approach.
 - Use technology to enhance student learning, retention, job placement, graduation, and employability.
 - Promote learning in areas of intellectual property, security, policy, business practice.
 - Explore how artistic and creative expression lead change in the digital world.



UFS Endorse Academic Goals

- University of Baltimore Goals and Priorities (Revised March 1, 2013)
 - With a Faculty Resource Availability Caveat
 - Lack of sufficient faculty resources to attain all goals in a meaningful, sustained way
 - Incentive and workload structures for individual faculty do not fully support goals.



Hopefully continuing trends (1)..

- Continued development of governance structure to bring about cultural change impacting our collective whole.
- A promise, we are a couple of years into, of 40 net, new faculty lines
- A director of writing came to UB.
 - Improve our track record in this critical skill area
- An effort to focus on successful programs in writing and math at other institutions.
 - Most feature more “hands on” roles for faculty and staff
 - Most feature smaller sections and more support



Hopefully continuing trends (2)..

- New policies for student success in today's world
 - Early Alert system
 - MOOCs as prior learning
 - Changes to FYE Experience
 - Other future changes encouraging rigor, better learning
- A recognition of the support our students need inside and outside of the classroom to be successful
- A congruence, or harmony, in strategic priorities of faculty, staff, and students.

UBSS Review of Budget Priorities

The UB Staff Senate would like to highlight our support for the following priorities:

- UBSS supports **increased staffing for the UB Police Department** to meet accreditation requirements.
- UBSS supports University funding of an **additional 1.0 percent merit salary increase**.
 - We further support ongoing efforts to attain salary equity where *salary compression or current market rates cause our existing salary structure not to be competitive*, and we encourage the administration to consider utilizing any additional funds to support these efforts.
 - This also supports the University's *preferred workplace initiative* and will assist in *retaining excellent faculty and staff*, which will become increasingly challenging as the economy improves.

UBSS Review of Budget Priorities

In addition, the UB Staff Senate would like to suggest inclusion of another institutional budget priority:

- Along with new faculty positions, UBSS supports **dedicated funding for new staff positions to adequately support enrollment growth**, both past and future, and to support any additional faculty positions as a result of the institutional budget priority.

Finally, the UB Staff Senate would like to underscore the very real possibility of funding impacts from the Affordable Care Act.

- The SGA endorses
 - Increased efforts at closing the achievement gap and college completion initiatives will increase retention and graduation. This will better prepare students for career and life success.
