Quantitative Sept. 26, Oct. 3, 10, 17 9am–1pm

Our 16-hour Quantitative Review, taught over four consecutive Saturdays, prepares you for the two quantitative question types, problem-solving and data sufficiency, which account for half of the questions encountered on the GMAT. The course is also excellent preparation for graduate quantitative business courses.

Pre-instruction Preparation: To ensure that you benefit from the Quantitative Review, answer the quantitative sample questions from the Diagnostic Test in the required text. If you score below average on either section (Problem Solving or Data Sufficiency), review the basic Arithmetic, Algebra and Geometry sections of the text. If you lack algebra preparation, you should consider taking UB's non-credit introductory algebra course, DVMA 93. Our Coordinator of Math Services, Yoosef Khadem, is available at any point to discuss your math background as well as other resources that may help develop your skills.

Critical Reasoning Oct. 24 9am–1pm

For most test-takers, critical reasoning questions are the most challenging questions on the verbal section of the GMAT. Our Critical Reasoning Review provides tips for understanding and evaluating critical reasoning arguments. While practicing with real GMAT questions, you'll develop strategies for identifying common critical reasoning question types and avoiding common reading and thinking errors.

Sentence Correction Oct. 31 9am–1pm

If you want to improve your verbal score on the GMAT, Sentence Correction is the place to start. Of all the verbal question types, Sentence Correction is the easiest to improve upon in a limited time. In this class you'll review the most commonly tested problem areas: pronouns, verbs, modifiers, comparison, and lists. In addition, you'll practice with actual exam questions and review effective general strategies.

Reading Comprehension Nov. 7 9am–1pm

Reading Comprehension questions are one of three question types on the verbal section of the GMAT. Our Reading Comprehension Review will provide tips for reading carefully and efficiently as well as techniques for reading on-line. While practicing with real GMAT questions, you'll learn to identify the six common reading comprehension question types and avoid common reading mistakes.
