Criminal Justice (J.D/M.S.)

Earn Both Law and Master's Degrees at the Same Time

UB offers students the opportunity to earn both the J.D. and the M.S. in Criminal Justice with 15 fewer credits than would be required if each degree were obtained separately. Admissions standards are high, as you must be admitted to both the UB School of Law and the master's program. Upon graduation, you will be prepared to specialize in and practice criminal law. The degree may enable you to become a defense or state prosecuting attorney.
