Policy on Absences Due to Religious Holidays - School of Law

It is the policy of the University of Baltimore School of Law to respect students' observance of their major religious holidays. Students not attending class because they are observing religious holidays are to be given excused absences up to the maximum number of allowable absences if they notify the professor in advance.

Students shall be given an opportunity, whenever possible, to make up within a reasonable time any academic assignments or tests that are missed due to individual participation in religious observance. Arrangements should be made to make up missed assignments or tests with the faculty member(s) in advance of the specific holiday. In addition, faculty are encouraged to video or audio record classes in which students have been excused for religious reasons if appropriate. Where video or audio recording is an adequate substitute for class and the student views or listens to the recording, the student shall be deemed to have attended the class. (approved May 2009)

Attendance Religious Holidays - SL

School of Law

Class attendance is a primary obligation of each student whose right to continued enrollment in the course and to take the examination is conditioned upon a record of attendance satisfactory to the professor. A student whose unexcused absences exceed three class periods (of 75 minutes each in a three-credit hour course, or of 50 minutes in a two-credit hour course) or whose total absences excused and unexcused exceed five class periods may be compelled to withdraw from the class or may be barred from the final examination.

It is the policy of the University of Baltimore School of Law to respect students' observance of their major religious holidays. Students not attending class because they are observing religious holidays are to be given excused absences if they notify the professor in advance, and those excused absences shall not be counted toward the maximum number of excused absences permitted by faculty policy.

Students shall be given an opportunity, whenever possible, to make up within a reasonable time any academic assignments or tests that are missed due to individual participation in religious observance. Arrangements should be made to make up missed assignments or tests with the faculty member(s) in advance of the specific holiday.
