# **Publications Design**

## This 36-credit program requires the following:

#### **Foundation Courses**

You may be required to take one or all of these courses based on an evaluation of your academic background and portfolio. PBDS 501: Introduction to Web Development and PBDS 502: Introduction to Graphic Design Principles cannot be counted toward the 36 credits required for the degree; PBDS 503: Workshop in Written Communication can count under certain circumstances toward the credits required for the degree.

## Required Courses (21 credits)

- Typography I (PBDS 615)
  - (This course should be taken within the first 9 credits of study; students who demonstrate advanced typography skills will be required to substitute PBDS 645: Typography II.)
- Words & Images: Creative Integration, 6 credits(PBDS 601)
  (This course should be taken early in the graduate degree program; students must achieve a grade of B [3.0] or better to meet degree requirements.)
- Visual & Verbal Rhetoric (PBDS 610)
- Web Development (PBDS 660)
  - (If you test out of this course, you must take an advanced hypermedia course.)
- Portfolio (PBDS 735)
  - (To be eligible for enrollment in this course, you must have completed all other requirements for graduation.)
- Seminar in Publications Design (PBDS 740)
  - (To be eligible for enrollment in this course, you must have completed all other requirements for graduation.)
