iStartStrong Assessment

The CIC's team are trained in administering the iStartStrong career assessment to students, which is designed to assist students in better understanding their career interests in terms of their key traits identified through John Holland's psychological theory. In this presentation, we help students to understand the meaning of the assessment they would take before the class presentation and how they can interpret their results, as well as the ways that their results can inform future career planning from the students.

Strengths

Strengths (IDIS): Students enrolled in IDIS 101 will be exposed to StrengthsQuest as part of their course assignment. The goal of this workshop is for students to recognize and articulate their top five talent themes, in both written and verbal forms.

Strengths (Introduction): Provides background of Strengths and introduces students to their top five talent themes. The goals of this workshop are:

- 1. students will practice articulating their five talent themes,
- 2. students will identify barrier labels associated with their talents, and
- 3. students will engage in goal setting activity on how to leverage their strengths academically and/or professionally.

Strengths (Leadership): This workshop dives into the importance of building a diverse team. The goals of this workshop are:

- 1. students will share ways they use their talent themes academically and/or professionally,
- 2. students will identify barriers labels associated with their talents,
- 3.students will be introduced to the four domains of strength and identify their individual contribution to a team, and
- 4. students will identify ways to leverage their strengths through the creation of professional mission statements.


Job Search Strategies
