Nondiscrimination, Bias Support and Sexual Misconduct

Alcohol and Drugs

Please note, despite the partial legalization of cannabis for adults 21 and over in the State of Maryland the use, possession, sale, and distribution of cannabis remains prohibited on university property, this includes medical cannabis. Cannabis is a controlled substance under federal law and the University must comply with the federal Drug-free Schools and Communities Act.
