Taxation/Estate Planning/Certificate in Family Law (APD) 2026–2027 Cost of Attendance (COA)

The Cost of Attendance (COA), sometimes referred to as your financial aid budget, is an estimate of the average total cost to attend The University of Baltimore (UBalt) for an academic year. The tables below list estimated costs for the 2026–2027 academic year. These estimates are subject to change pending state legislation and approval by the University System of Maryland Board of Regents.

The Cost of Attendance includes both direct costs (such as tuition and fees) and indirect expenses associated with attending school that do not appear on your university bill. Estimated student budgets for personal living expenses reflect modest and reasonable spending patterns of UBalt students. Indirect expenses are based on a standard 15-week instructional period per semester and are informed by research conducted by the Office of Financial Aid, including average costs for books, supplies, transportation, and other living expenses. These estimates are subject to change.

The following Cost of Attendance estimates are based on the anticipated enrollment for your academic career.
