HIGHER EDUCATION LEADERSHIP AND ADMINISTRATION EXPERIENCE

Dean, College of Public Affairs, University of Baltimore, Baltimore, Maryland. July 1, 2015 to Present.

I lead the College of Public Affairs (CPA) at the University of Baltimore. CPA is the State of Maryland's only College completely dedicated to public service and improving lives. The College provides a "pathway to public service" in which leaders are educated in a diverse, urban, engaged setting that leverages the numerous opportunities of Baltimore in government, nonprofits, applied politics, public policy, health, and the justice system. In 2016, we increased our US News and World Report ranking from #75 to #68 nationally among graduate programs in Public Affairs. This placed the College in the top 25% of programs.

As Dean of the College of Public Affairs, I serve as the Chief Academic Officer and manager of three schools (Public and International Affairs, Criminal Justice, and Health and Human Service) and two Centers (Schaefer Center for Public Policy and the Center for Drug Policy and Enforcement—added in 2017). The College is the largest in headcount at the University of Baltimore (ranging between 1650 and 1798 students), offers over 20 graduate, undergraduate and non-degree academic majors and certificates. The College produced 6 straight years of record enrollment up until fall of 2017. The College employs over 40 full-time faculty and 12 staff members with programs offered in person, online, and in hybrid form at its main campus in Central Baltimore and at the Universities at Shady Grove near Washington, DC. Education access and social mobility are strengths of the University of Baltimore and the College.

The College is the most diverse on campus with a population of students that averages 28 years old, majority African-American, female, and a majority of undergraduates who are Pell eligible. Graduate and professional

students make up the majority of CPA students at nearly 900. They are generally part-time, working professionals in a host of fields who often juggle family, work, and school

Major Accomplishments:

Administration and Finance

- Managed an annual budget of over \$5 million that has supported significant enrollment growth through Spring 17.
- Efficiency. CPA produces the largest net revenue of UB's Colleges on the smallest budget, endowment, staff capacity, and scholarships.
- Achieved over a 10% increase in the College budget from FY17 to meet College enrollment growth. This occurred at a time of university-wide cuts by re-allocation of faculty lines and of adjunct budgets.
- Secured 4 new faculty lines and a new academic advisor from FY16 through FY17 on the basis of a collaboratively developed hiring plan.
- Managed university budget cuts in FY 16 to protect the mission of the College while making its operations more efficient. Examples include restricting of degree programs, new programs at Shady Grove, and maximization of faculty teaching resources.
- Led Dean's Office toward a data-driven operations and strategic decision-making on enrollment, credit hours, level of adjunct teaching, and course fill rates. Led to re-allocation of resources to the College, efficiencies in course offerings, and progress on reallocation of scholarships to the College.
- Reformed the implementation of Faculty Travel Funding in the College

Curriculum and New College-Wide Initiatives

- Added the Center for Drug Policy and Enforcement to CPA in 2017. It houses the DC/Baltimore High Impact Drug Trafficking Area primarily funded by the US Office of National Drug Control Policy. The Center has already vastly expanded University and College policy networks, has added over \$3 million in grant activity to the University, and has begun collaboration with faculty and students.
- Creation of the US Department of Education funded Second Change Pell program that offers education to Inmates at Jessup Correctional Institution. The program has grown to 50 students and has a terrific retention rate.
- Created the Community Development Fellows program. An internal and externally funded program that pays our best and brightest to work in Baltimore City neighborhood-level community development organizations.
- Accreditation/Assessment. Re-accreditation and Maintenance experience including Middle States Commission on Higher Education; Network of Schools of Public Policy, Affairs, and Administration (NASPAA); Association of University Programs in Health Administration (AUPHA); Academy of Criminal Justice Sciences (ACJS).
- Planning new accreditation/certifications including Commission on Accreditation of Healthcare Management Education (CAHME) and Council for Standards in Human Services Education (CSHSE)
- Initiated and implemented 2 new graduate programs based at the Universities at Shady Grove and a China cohort for the MS in Forensic Sciences-High Tech Crime.
- Initiated and created new international partnerships with the University of Palermo (Italy), Northwest University of Political Science and Law (Xi'an, China), Century College (Beijing), Tecnológico de Monterrey (Mexico City). Several resulted in signed LOIs and MOUs for exchange.
- Led reform of several degree programs (BS in Nonprofit Management and Community Leadership/BS in International Studies) and advanced new Accelerated degree programs.
- In 2017, Initiated planning for new online degree programs in the College and program prioritization/restructuring of existing degrees
