

## UNIVERSITY OF BALTIMORE SCHOOL OF LAW RECIPROCITY POLICY

The University of Baltimore provides services to students and graduates of other law schools within the following guidelines:

- 1. Services are available to current third-year law students and graduates of those law schools that allow University of Baltimore law alumni and/or students to use their facilities. To request reciprocity, please email the Law Career Development Office at lawcareer@ubalt.edu.
- 2. Requests for services must be made, in writing, by the placement or career counseling administrator prior to the rendering of any services. The student or graduate will receive a letter authorizing our school's reciprocity services.
- 3. Reciprocity is granted for two months beginning with the date your online access begins. Reciprocity may be renewed once during the academic year. Reciprocity is **not** available from June 1 through October 1 and other peak times as determined by the LCDO.
- 4. Reciprocity privileges include remote access to our on-line job bank via 12Twenty.
- 5. The following services are **not** available:
  - a. On-campus interviewing
  - b. Resume referral
  - c. Participation in job fairs
  - d. Career counseling appointments
- 6. The Law Career Development Office may restrict or revoke reciprocity privileges to any individual who misuses our services, or to any school surpassing a reasonable number of requests during an academic year.
- 7. Requests for reciprocity can be made to only one of the Maryland law schools. Therefore, you may choose either the University of Baltimore School of Law <u>or</u> the University of Maryland Francis King Carey School of Law. There is no reciprocity agreement between the two Maryland law schools.
